Second, I have a duty to make responsible decisions to shape the future of our great City."

Ike Kelly followed Peggy and had no trouble projecting but in fairness to him I pulled info from his web site also.

"I have lived in Southeast Denver for 34 years. I have been married to my wife Beverly for 34 years and together we have raised five beautiful children, all of whom we proudly sent to Denver Public Schools. I'm running for city council because Southeast Denver needs stronger representation at city hall, and in our community.
