
President Michael asks, "Do we have a drawing?"






2016 MS Run the US Relay Team

Kaitlyn Morgan

Paul Bernard introduces **Bill Morgan** who joined us in August of 2014, and who has a personal connection to our speaker this morning. Bill introduces his daughter <u>Kaitlyn Morgan</u> who is here to speak about the MS Run the US Relay Team that she is a part of running here in Colorado. The Relay begins on April 9, 2016 in Los Angeles, CA and is completed in August 2016 in New York, NY.

Kaitlyn will be running a 182-mile leg in six



days from Steamboat Springs to Denver. That's over a marathon a day, for six days! She has been selected to run as part of the team that runs across the US to raise money and awareness to fight

slow down or not happen at all. Each person who has MS has a unique set of symptoms and there is no cure, only medication and treatment to slow the progression.

For the MS Run the US each relay runner runs 5 to 10 days and seeks pledges to raise \$10,000 to donate to the MS Society. Kaitlyn is supported by a van and crew that accompany her as she runs and provides support feed and provide a place for her to sleep and rest. She trains for the event by putting in high mileage weekly including speed work and long runs on the Saturday and Sunday.

During Kaitlyn's run last year she was reminded of the discouraging aspects of the disease. Things including no known cure and the daily struggles with life living with this

disease were some of the issues she contemplated during her long days on the road. The mental anguish of putting your body through that kind of physical stress were also a large part of the event. When the body is put through extreme tests of physical limits, the stress at times can be overwhelming. Kaitlyn told us about being in such physical strain that she had to stop and was reduced to tears. Having her mother and father there as part of her crew were emotional support factors that inspired her. At one point on day 3 of her relay leg, she was only able to continue after having her mother run with her and by telling her to put one foot in front of the other, again, and

again. She also has a "family" of people who helped her that are from the organizing group. A large part of the reward from the experience comes from the ability to let go of inhibitions that she and her family have, and through the physical experiences they have with themselves to be open and share with a new group of people.

On day 4 of last year's event she had to let others run for her due to physical pain she was experiencing. Her mother, brother, and others were able to complete that leg and support her in the miles of that day. All to find a cure for MS, she hopes to do this until a cure is found. You run rain or shine and the miles across the US are but a reminder of the physical toll the disease takes on the suffering from it.

The club has a long history with supporting this cause, starting back some 20 years' members of this club have ridden and volunteered during aid stations in support of this living with MS. We salute Kaitlyn, Bill, and her entire family as they work to end this terrible disease.
