Other Recognition



Tree Lot has Record Year

Tree Lot Kahuna **Joe Marci** reported that the Club sold a total of 1421 trees in 2006, with Noble Firs being the top seller at 575. Our least popular tree was the Scotch Pine with 59 sold, while the White Pines were barely ahead with 60. This was Monaco South's second best year, trailing only 1999 when 1454 trees were sold.

We sold 1900 feet of garland (that's more than a quarter mile of garland - - a Club record!), eclipsing last years' total by 500 feet. There were 368 wreaths sold this year, 19 more than last year.

Thanks to all the help from MSOCer and their friends and families, as well as student volunteers from Thomas Jefferson High School, the

2006 Tree Lot had the best financial results in the Club's history!
