We also need people with pickup trucks to haul the stuff over from our storage area at lliff and Valencia. We will be assisted by members of the Tamarac Optimist Club in pricing the trees.

The lot is located on the northwest corner of Iliff and Monaco. Thanks to **Steve Kady**, we once again have visible signage and the trailer is in place, Thanks to **Gary Miller** for arranging the generator. Thanks to **Mike Miller** for the garlands, wreaths and helping set up the electrical elements.

The key to a successful tree lot is staffing. To this end, there are two co-managers for each day of the week, whose



responsibility it is to ensure the lot is properly staffed. There is an online calendar/signup sheet which you can get to by going to the Monaco South website <a href="https://www.monacosouth.org">www.monacosouth.org</a>, then click on "Tree Lot Schedule" (See left side of page). This

Once you have signed up, you are responsible for ensuring that the shift is staffed, either by yourself or by someone else. If you are unable to work the shift, you must find someone else to cover.

Those who work 15-hours or more can buy anything on the lot at cost. Shifts are normally 3-hours, but you can work longer if your able. There are jobs for everyone, including those who may not be able to schlepp trees. Our goal is having at least 100 of our 140+ members participate.

This is a great time to meet your fellow members and to get to know them a little more personally.

This is also a time to "sell" Optimism, to explain what we are all about. You can have a great time while working. Most of our customers are repeats and are here not because we have the cheapest trees in town, but because they are treated well and they know we support their communities and, especially, their kids.
