TODAYS SPEAKER

Our speaker today was Captain Bobby Kmak the commander of Station 22 and a 16-year veteran of the Denver Fire Department. Captain Kmak told us of the many activities his firefighters are involved in as well as their primary job —— putting out fires! Among the ones he talked about were: the necessity of exercise to stay in shape, whether running up and down stairs or playing football; housecleaning and building maintenance to keep their firehouse in good shape (also saves labor costs); testing 6600 feet of hoses every year; inspecting 700 businesses a year; individual training in EMS/EMT and other disciplines; staying perfect in basic firefighting techniques; and,upward training, acting officers and engineers. Captain kmak also mentioned the volunteer activities he and his crew participate in such as cerebral palsey, scout troops and school briefings, fire safety classes, etc. They also have a program called "firefighter for a day" in which an individual visits the firehouse for lunch or dinner, is briefed on the equip-

Turning to practical matters he told us that their rig makes about 2400 runs a year. Theirs is eight years old and while it averages 9800 miles a year the wear and tear on the engine is much greater than the mileage would indicate due to the necessity to run the engine at high speeds while stopped at a fire to provide power for their equipment. He also said that approximately 90% of their budget goes to staffing. New rigs are in the budget for the Department but on a prioritized basis and he hopes to get one next year! It was a very interesting talk and our thanks to Captain Kmak!
