March of Dimes MUDD Volleyball: Cy Reagan announced that the Mudd Volley ball fund raiser will be Saturday, August 7th. He needs at lease 12 parking lot attendance so sign up and let Cy or Joe Marci know. The location will be at Majestic Commercenter, Aurora (off of I-70 and Tower Rd.). So that you are aware, In 2008 MUDD Volleyball celebrated its 25th Anniversary. Over the years it has become one of the largest annual fundraisers for the Colorado Chapter of the March of Dimes - raising over \$200,000 annually. The funds raised through this event support our mission of improving the health of babies by preventing birth defects, premature birth and infant mortality. The tournament pits over 300 co-ed teams, comprised of 8-12 players each, against each other in knee deep MUDD. Over 3,000 individuals play in the tournament and as many as 1000 spectators come to watch.

Today's Speaker

Our speaker today, introduced by **Paul Bernard** was Jerry Short with Parker Sprinkler Supply. Jerry discussed the many ways both Parker and Denver Water are following strict water management. Jerry passed on some interesting facts.

- An acre foot of water is the amount of water 1' deep over the area of one football field.
- We use an average of 100 gallons / person / day.
- The majority of lawns in our area are blue grass and do not require a lot of water, if you allow it to go dormant during the hot summer months. Dry brown spots will green up in the fall.
- Spring and fall good for blue grass. Buffalo grass only uses half the water that blue grass does.
- One half of the trees that die are caused by a shortage of water the other half die from over watering.
- Aerate 2-3 times a year.
- Detaching in not necessary.
- Fertilize 2-3 times a year.
- Xeriscape is protected by Colorado law, even if your local development or HOA says it is not allowed.
