CO-WY District Optimist Junior Golf
Bob Meyer, Joe Marci, and Ron Cisco

Bob Meyer opened with a video produced by O.I. detailing the highlights and vision for the Optimist International Golf Tournament for 10-18 year old boys and girls. You can see this video by going to <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Amdl04x40ZY>.

The Tournament is held in Florida at the same course the PGA conducts their annual Honda Classic. The long tee boxes are used by all for the 16 - 18 year old flights. Highlights from the 2-minute video included a large selection of different ways to say, "How in believe in myself." There was also consensus for "The #17 Bear Trap" as being the hardest and best hole on all the courses. It should be noted Jack Nicklaus is the designer of the Championship Course. The entire layout consists of 4 - 18 hole regulation courses.

Every year the O.I. Tournament has 600 + entrants from 30 countries. The Opening ceremonies, led by bagpipers, features flags from all the countries represented and is held in the PGA Ballroom and attended by over 1,000 families, friends, coaches, sponsors and players. There is also a wide assortment of family and entertainment venues, including pool, games, swimming and hanging out. "It's a blast!" Seems to be the common theme. Mark Hubbard, a recent winner in the 16 - 18 age group is currently playing on the PGA Tour, Windham Clark is on the Oklahoma State golf team, and Hanna Ward was recently featured on the cover of Golf Week, just to name a few past players.

The cost of sending a player to the tournament is \$3,000. A \$500 of which is contributed by the CO/WY Optimist District for the benefit of each entry. Last year there were twenty players from the District, with 23 - 25

anticipated this year. **Ron Cisco** is heading up the fundraising for hole sponsorship beginning with \$100. Please see Ron for all the other available opportunities. Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson, and many other PGA notables have contributed to the Championships in the past.

Joe Marci has a Rockies fundraiser scheduled in June. Tickets are \$15 each and are on the field level third base side, Section 141. You can use the O.I. pass through program to gain tax deductions for your contributions. Last year **Pat Bush** purchased \$300 worth of hole sponsorships. We anticipate a record number of young hopeful qualifiers participating this

year. Volunteers and observers are needed at every venue, so please consider helping out. We need to raise \$25,000 in order to adequately sponsor our winners.

Locally, we conduct three qualifying tournaments held at Boulder and Denver area courses, as well as a District fundraiser tournament at Park Hill Golf Club on Tuesday, June 9th. See Joe for details. The featured events at the tournament will be both the Ron Cisco long and short drive contests. Plus, Joe and Bob will supervise a blind-folded putting contest, closest to the pin. Do not miss this exciting and fun filled extravaganza.

Junior Golf is a wonderful O.I. Program. Without the expert guidance and commitment of Joe, Ron, Bob and others, our District could not have become one of the most active and productive Districts in all of Optimist International.
