- A Publicity Chair will be established. Advertising in the community for tree sales and other events will be established and promulgated through local businesses and media outlets.
- The Board will reassess the Budget after the tree lot income is established and adjust as necessary.
- More one-on-one orientation with new members and follow-up with members not attending on a regular basis will be conducted.
- Financial Reports and Minutes will be made available to any member, as requested. President Ron will give a recap of each Board Meeting immediately following said meeting. Board attendance by any member is encouraged, especially for new ideas or programs.
- A long-term strategic planning session was proposed for early May or June 2010.
- A proposal for entering as many Clubs in the St. Patrick's Day Parade for the purpose of promoting Optimists and the 2010 national convention was presented. Follow-up will be forthcoming.
