he bring us Missy Franklin's father, he has now produced a Denver legend, Jim Saccomano. Jim is a Denver native who started his sports career as a statistician with the Denver Bears (The precursor to the Rockies, for those of you who are "new" to town). Jim, who is currently Vice President of Corporate Communications has been with the Broncos for over 30 years. Jim is recognized as one of the most

accomplished public relations professionals in NFL history as well as the longest tenured pro sports administrator in Colorado.

Jim has written several books about his experiences with the Broncos, including: "Denver Broncos: The Complete Illustrated History" with forward by John Elway and "Game of My Life Denver Broncos: Memorable Stories of Bronco Football."

Saccomano fielded questions from the members and was brief and forthright with his responses. Some examples:

Question: How good is Peyton Manning, really? Answer: Calling Peyton Manning "Great" is an understatement. He will probably go down as one of the top 50 football players of all time. Peyton has a fantastic memory which allows him to recognize defenses and switch plays at the line of scrimmage, which very few quarterbacks can do well.

Question: Why do players keep getting into trouble?

Don't they have some kind of classes on how to behave?

Answer: Players have a full week session at the beginning of the season, but there are a lot of temptations out there

Question: Who are some of the most "community active" of the Broncos?

Answer: John Elway, of course. Rich Karlis and Karl Meklenburg were very giving. Bob Griese started "Judy's House" while in Houston and supports it even after he left Houston.

Question: Was Tim Tebow overrated?
