Speaker Andrea Mauro

Tom Mauro introduced his daughter Andrea Mauro, President and Founder of Chiaroveggente Productions, a video company specializing in life issues. After graduating from UCD with a B.A. in Fine Arts-Video Production, Andrea immersed herself in creating a video company that focused on recording Financial, Intellectual and Legacy concerns. Financial relates to assets held, including those family holdings, morals, wisdom, experience and memories. Intellectual relates to that which you learn, share, take into life to keep, or discard. Legacy relates to Last Will and Testament issues. This was the main thrust of the highly informative presentation.

Yes that's, Chiaroveggente or chi-ar-o-veg-gen-te (keyar-o-veh-gen-tay), adj. ital. Defined as, 1. having the paranormal power of seeing objects or actions beyond the range of natural vision. 2. quick, intuitive knowledge of things and people; sagacity.

Before explaining what the production and content of a Legacy video should contain Andrea walked us through the basics of the equipment and technique to be used. The main objective is to make sure the person being interviewed is comfortable, the camera and tripod are secured and the background is pleasant to the eye. The subject matter should be reviewed before filming and surprises should be avoided. Once everything is set to go the production begins.

The objectives of Legacy are framed around what is important to the testator, the one giving and the devisees, the one(s) receiving. Andrea showed three examples of themes that can be used to get the message across. The first was The Queen and Petesio (Families). It chronicled the joining of two families with candor and humor, beginning with the Colorado Candy Company and ending with a lifelong history of what followed. The second was



Bank on Ed, explaining where the money came from and when, how and where it was going. The final was entitled Amazing Grace about a lady named Grace who shared her life and times with her family. Her final words of advice were, Be honest, thoughtful, don't smoke and always go to Church." When asked if anyone followed her advice she said no one went to Church. It was a funny ending.

Andrea recommended any Last Will and Testament video be accompanied with an attorney's certification, dated and recorded with the video. It is an interesting concept and more people are using this service as their final good-bye to friends and family. We give our thanks to Andrea for sharing this emerging and helpful service with us. It was an enlightening presentation.
