Denver's Urban Farm at Stapleton

Our Speaker today was introduced by **Bill Wells**; Amy Star from the Urban Farm (http://www.theurbanfarm.org/) whose mission is to teach agricultural and environmental

education to urban youth and children. She became involved in the Urban Farm by her daughter who started visiting the farm when she was 4. It is farm that keeps over 200 animals, including 60

The farm teaches applied animal and plant sciences to

The farm teaches applied animal and plant sciences to urban children and youth through hands-on, experiential learning opportunities. They offer after school educational programs for kids to come and work with the animals in a farm setting. Families can volunteer to work with the animals or with gardens that need constant attention. One program, Embracing Horses, works with 400 kids each year. Preschoolers and kindergarten age children are included as well. We should mention that Amy's power point presentation

that she gave today was done by the thirteen year old son of a director with the farm.

The farm contains 23 acres and includes an indoor arena that is a featured facility. All this is available for the \$25 annual membership for a child or \$30 for a family membership. Monaco South has many members who count themselves as former 4-H Club members. Your editor, being from the *Tall Corn State*, recalls many great 4-H projects he has seen. The Urban Farm is a great resource that provides a unique chance for kids and families to experience the agricultural benefits we all benefit from. See story related pictures on page 3.


Joe Marci encourages members to renew their entertainment books through him. New editions should be available in August. We'll look forward to it.
