TODAY'S SPEAKERS



NICK MELLIADIS and RAY MOHR

Our speakers today were Ray Mohr and Nick Melliadis. Ray is employed at the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment where he works in the Air Pollution Control Division. He has worked there since 1978 and helps develop air quality plans and programs. Nick is retired from the Health Department. He worked on providing information and support to small businesses needing air pollution permits. Now he paints, plays music and along with Ray is an active storyteller. Ray and Nick developed and presented a number of in-house training programs and have also presented workshops on a variety of topics.

Introduced by <u>John Moser</u>, their presentation was two-fold as they stressed the importance of story-telling and then used that vehicle to talk a little about air pollution and the environment. They melded these back in the 1980's when carbon monoxide levels in Denver was bad as a way of teaching kids about air pollution. They did not want to scare the kids, so storytelling, weaving the dangers of polluted air into an interesting story was a way to get their message across.
