Heidi Ganahl Candidate for CU Regent

Frank Middleton introduced our speaker for today, <u>Heidi Ganahl</u>. Heidi is a graduate of University of Colorado Boulder, founder and CEO of Camp Bow Wow, mother of four, current Director of CU Foundation and recently launched a new non-profit, "Moms Fight Back." Ms. Ganahl is currently running for a seat on the CU Board of Regents as an "at large" candidate.

Heidi explained that the University of Colorado system consists of four campuses: University of Colorado Boulder (CU), University of Colorado in Colorado Springs (UCCS), University of Colorado Denver (UCD) and the Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora. The system educates more than 70,000 students per year and is the third largest employer in the state of Colorado. The CU system is governed by an elected nine-member Board of Regents. Colorado is only one of four states that elects its regents.

Key points in Heidi's campaign:

I'll work hard to protect freedom of speech – Our university is not the place to limit free speech and thought, it's the place for feisty debate and letting our students hear both sides of the story to make their own decisions about what they believe. Colleges and Universities are places for learning more about oneself, others, and the world, areas where anyone should be unable to speak their mind. I will work to return the debate and tenacity to our campuses.

I'll work hard to keep our students safe -

Terrorism, alcohol and drug abuse, depression and campus sexual assault are just some of the things I plan to work tirelessly to prevent. We need to take a much stronger lead in heading off these threats. Many campus issues go unaddressed or are handled improperly. We cannot let fear deter our students from getting the most out of their educational opportunities and safety is paramount.

I'll work to make sure college is affordable – Any student that wants to attend should have the ability to do so, without racking up a huge student loan debt while they're doing it. I'll bring my experience as a successful entrepreneur to CU to drive down costs, increase innovative funding (in order to stop relying on state funding to increase, in case it doesn't) and improve the quality of education.

And finally I'm determined to do all we can to get our graduates great jobs – I will ensure that student's time and dollars are well spent at our university. Students are the future of this great country and we need to give them the opportunities to get the best job they can. This will put our nation's future in a position of success an opportunity.

During the Q& A session MS Ganahl proved a good match for the quick minds of the MSOC members and was able to answer almost all questions without hesitation. Her presentation was professional and informative.
