Excellence in Education: **Tom Mauro** announced that he is looking for nominations for the *Excellence in Education Award*. Anyone who knows an outstanding or innovative teacher, administrator, or councilor should nominate them for this award. The selection criteria is as follows:

- ♦ Educator selected should be of first priority from a school currently served by Monaco South. This does not preclude selection of a more than deserving Educator from a school outside of Monaco South's service area. For example, Connie Ackerman was from DU and was recognized for her involvement in Odyssey of the Mind; Beth Gower taught at East High and was recognized for her involvement with the East High Constitutional Scholars. (East High could be considered a school in Monaco South's service area).
- ♦ Educator performance must be of an outstanding nature for a sustained period of time of at least five years.
- ♦ Approval of Educator's principal or supervisor is strongly suggested.
- One Educator per year should be selected although unusual circumstances might allow more than one given a team teaching award or other group award.
- ♦ Educators receiving a Colorado Teacher of the Year Award and serving in the Monaco South Optimist service area should become candidates for the award based on the rigorous evaluation the Colorado Teacher of the Year Awards give recipients. While this is significant recognition in itself, it should not be an automatic reason Monaco South would give its award. The primary requirement and determination is based Monaco South's determination of the contribution the committee believes is made to the Monaco South service

area and school(s).

- Educators who receive the Colorado Teacher awards should not be excluded from the Monaco South Award because the Monaco South Award will carry unique meaning and status to the awardee based on the contribution to the Monaco South Service area and students.
- ♦ Retired Educators not currently serving may be eligible for the award.
- ♦ Educators including administrators, staff, and teachers are eligible for the award.
- Educators receiving the award must be of superior citizenship and character.
- ♦ Educators receiving the award may not receive it twice.

Our Speaker John Hames The American Car Prospector

Our guest speaker today is a pioneer in his field. He is an investigator, a car lover, a storyteller, a TV producer, and an entrepreneur. John Hames grew up in Denver and went to Cherry Creek High School. He developed a love for classic cars and an interest in TV and producing films and combined them into his vocation. To do this, he had to develop a character so he combined his love for classic cars with his western heritage and thus was born the *American Car Prospector*.

The American Car Prospector is now a television program seen around the world.

John emphasizes that he is not a car collector but rather a storyteller. He searches the back-country to find rare classic cars to tell the stories behind the cars and their owners. Finding cars that have been restored is not as appealing as finding cars that are in their original condition. Colorado is a great hunting ground since the climate here is very kind to the preservation of older model cars.

Many of the cars John finds are still in possession of their original owners. He told a story about when he was lost in the downtown Littleton area and he drove by an open garage that was obviously used as a storage shed rather than a garage. He saw the end of an older model car with boxes and "other junk" stacked on top of and around it. After John had driven by the garage still trying to find his way, it proved to be too much of a temptation to pass up and he turn back to investigate.

John found that it was an early model "Bullet" Ford Mustang and was still in possession of the original owner. He had parked the car in 1989, it still had all of the original equipment, and while it had a few dings, it was in relatively good shape. John purchased this car and with a little work got the car running again. He has left the dings as he found them but has featured the car on the TV program. In fact, he now calls the car the War Horse. He also told the story of a 95-year-old man that he found in Arkansas who had not ridden in a car for 75 years. John took this man for a ride and the man was amazed at the power steering and power windows but he just could

not figure out why door locks were required. He also wondered what that "ticking sound" was that he heard periodically. After John explained that, it was the turn signal used to tell the other drivers, which way John was, going to turn the man was amazed that the other drivers could even hear that ticking sound.
