Monaco South Club Finances 101

From our Treasure, **Ron Gustus**, unlike many service clubs no portion of weekly breakfast, coffee, or roll costs are included in annual/quarterly member dues. The Club pays costs to the American Legion Hall as follows:

- For use of the facility <u>a \$1 fee is paid for each</u> <u>attending member per meeting</u>.
- The Club pays the Legion Hall a separate amount for the breakfast, coffee, rolls, etc., at a rate less than what restaurants would charge.

The objective is to break-even on these costs and member charges are variable based on their choice. Charges are as follows:

- Full breakfast, plus tax and room charge (\$1) = \$7
- Coffee only (\$1) and room charge (\$1) = \$2
- Roll only (\$1) and room charge (\$1) = \$2
- Coffee (\$1), roll (\$1) and room charge (\$1) = \$3
- Orange Juice (\$1) and room charge (\$1) = \$2

Members attending and not having anything to eat or drink should pay \$1 to the cashier to cover the room charge. The Club pays costs for project guests, <u>potential new members</u>, and speakers. <u>Nonpotential</u> member guest costs are to be paid by the host member. **Don St. John** has meal tickets available for members wanting to pay for multiple week charges. Your Board appreciates everyone's cooperation in helping out.

this project which took him 10 months to complete, working mostly with the FAA, Centennial Air Port, Flight for Life, AirLife, and Colorado Division of Aeronautics. Truly an amazing project.

Overall the award winners' projects took 2,637 hours to complete, which is over 1 and guarter years of work (40 hour work weeks). We can consider our own club and imagine the work it takes to organize and complete new projects and these projects are lead by young boys!
