Dumb Friends League

Our Speaker. <u>Lisa Palmer</u>, from Dumb Friends League of Denver was introduced by **Don Thomson**.

She observed we are a "slightly different demographic" than her typical kindergarten kids. The Denver Dumb Friends operation is one of the largest in the country. Besides the Denver facility at Quebec and Evans, they have a satellite facility in Castle Rock. They also just opened the Harmony Equine Center in Franktown, a unique private facility for horses, ponies, donkeys and mules that have been removed from their owners by law enforcement authorities. The facility hosts about a hundred horses.

Lisa emphasized that strong efforts are made for sheltering lost and relinquished pets, adopting pets to new homes, investigating animal cruelty, reducing pet overpopulation, and educating the public about animals and their needs. The Dumb Friends League is very proud of the 80% live release rate.

The staff includes five veterinarians. The entire program deals with 19,000 animals per year with a budget of \$15m. During Lisa's presentation about training animals taken in, **John Young** shared he has not been able to train the two cats he got from the league five
