TODAY'S SPEAKER

Our speaker today was Carolyn Brink who serves on the Board of Directors of the Emily Griffith Foundation. Prior to that, she spent 15 years as an administrator at the Emily Griffith Opportunity School, serving as coordinator of Consumer and Family Studies, Assistant Principal, and Director of Support Services.

This is the 90th anniversary of the school and Carolyn told us of the early history of the school and Emily Griffith's life. Emily was born in 1868 in Ohio, moved to Nebraska and taught in a Sod school house before moving to Denver and starting the school that bears her name. She retired in 1933, moved to Pinecliffe and was murdered in 1947.

Located in downtown Denver since 1916 the school is a public postsecondary college dedicated to responding to the educational needs of the community. The school remains true to Emily Griffith's philosophy, "to serve all who wish to learn".

The Emily Griffith High School retrieves approximately 350 dropouts annually. They provide education in six of the fastest growing occupations. They have served 1.5 million students since 1916, have an 89% employment rate and a 69% graduation rate. Most programs provide marketable skills in one year of less!
