Our Speaker

Our special guest speaker today was Carrie Nolan. She is the President of the Colorado Chapter of the National Multiple Sclerosis Society. The mission of the organization is to mobilize people and resources to drive research for a cure and to address the challenges of everyone affected by MS. Multiple Sclerosis is a disease that affects the central nervous system by disrupting the flow of information from the brain to the body. It is an elusive disease with no known cause and no known cure. Symptoms vary from person to person depending on where the central nervous system is affected, making it hard to diagnose. MS generally strikes in the prime of life – ages 20-50, and 73% of those diagnosed are women. The Colorado Chapter contributes research funds each year to the National MS Society's nearly \$40 million annual research budget. The Society is the largest private MS research funder in the nation, providing support for 335 research projects worldwide. The MS 150 is expected to raise \$3.2 million this year.
