Essay Contest Winners from Thomas Jefferson High School

MSOC members were treated with the Essay Contest Winners from Thomas Jefferson High School. This year's Optimist International theme was: "How my Education is the key to a successful future."

First Place winner was Brianna Romero, who was absent due to an illness. In her place was TJ's own AP Literature Teacher, Ms. Susan Stokley, to read Brianna's winning essay. Second place winner was Audrey Colleen Morris-Reihl



with her mom Brenda and dad John. Third place winner (and Super Citizen recipient) Rachael Angele Newman was with her mother Yvette. Also present was TJ's Principal, Ms. Sandra Just and ten year veteran judge Paula Kauffman representing the Essay Contest judges.

Wyatt McCallie shared with the group how the Essay Contest works. Ms. Stokley advertises the program at Thomas Jefferson, and subsequently the six top submitted essays are selected. Wyatt then reproduces and delivers three sets of the essays, scrubbed of the writer's names, to Joe Marci. Joe, in turn, delivers the essays to three judges. The essays are graded by a ranking method, and the tabulated results determine the winners. With complete anonym-



ity, the winning Essay is then submitted to district, where Brianna Romero finished in Second Place. Outstanding job Brianna!

Ms. Stokley read Brianna's impressive essay with great articulation, starting with, "Education has provided an ample supply of hopes and dreams..." Questions were directed to both Ms. Stokley and Principal
