

Girls Inc of Metro Denver

Girls Inc was started in West Denver with the goal of preventing teen pregnancy. It has grown considerably and currently provides services for girls between the ages of 6 and 19 with out-of-school-time programs at their facility in West Denver and with community outreach programs in schools and youth service organizations. Their facility in Denver provides a safe environment where girls can find support and positive role models. In 2003 they started working with girls in the juvenile corrections system. In all, they will serve approximately 3,000 girls in the Denver metro area this year. In response to a question regarding how they differ from Boys and Girls Club, our speaker, Monica Villa Lobos, explained that they are gender specific and the programs they offer are researched and developed by the national organization with which they are affiliated.

They provide training for other youth services organizations in the use of 2 of those programs - Preventing Adolescent Pregnancy® curriculum and Friendly PEERsuasion® curriculum. Both are considered to be very effective programs. Girls Inc receives very little federal assistance and most of their funding comes from foundations and private sources.
