

The Advanced Placement U.S. Government and Politics class at East High School won the State Competition of "We the People...the Citizen and the Constitution." In April twenty-seven students will go to Washington to compete in the National competition against the best teams from the other forty-nine states plus the District of Columbia. In this highly rigorous, academic competition the students will speak persuasively in a simulated congressional hearing format, directly respond to posited questions, and use philosophical, historical, contemporary, and legal evidence to support their assertions.

Our team will continue to work hard, and we will represent our community and Colorado in the East High tradition. It is an opportunity to demonstrate the competitiveness and skill of East High Angels and Colorado in a forum that includes the best and brightest students in the United States.

We are now faced with the enormous task of raising **\$45**, **000** to pay for the team's trip to Washington D.C. Many East High School alumni are contributing to our cause, but we also need the assistance of larger groups, foundations, and businesses to meet our financial deadlines. The cost of sending one student to Washington D.C. is **\$1**,275.00. A copy of our budget needs is included in this packet. We deeply appreciate as much funding as you are able to give.
