TODAY'S SPEAKER

Freddie introduced our speaker, Mel Goldberg, who spoke about "SAR EL" (Service for Israel). This program provides civilian volunteers who serve two, three or four weeks in Israel and frees up the Israeli military to perform their primary mission and also helps morale. While on duty at various bases throughout the country, the volunteers wear military uniforms (but are not in the military). They perform "mundane but necessary work" such as sorting and folding clothing, working on equipment, etc.

Mel, who is 83 years old, said that SAR EL is always looking for volunteers to serve and that if he could do it anyone can! Men and women come from all over the world to help and language is not a problem. He mentioned that 30% of the volunteers are not Jewish. The normal work week is Monday through Thursday and week-ends are free for travel in Israel. A normal day consisted of breakfast, work from 8:30 to 11:30, lunch (the main meal), work from 1:30 to 4:30, supper and discussion groups from 7:15 to 9:00. Mel lived in a 4-man rustic hut and thoroughly enjoyed his experience in-country.

Mel mentioned that Colorado is 8 times larger than Israel and about 2 million Muslims (1/3 of the population) live there. The Arab birth rate is 4 times that of the Israelis and does not bode well for the future. TV has lots of Hebrew programming, plus the BBC and some Arab.
