

<u>The Brain Bowl is Coming</u>: Karl Giel shouted, it is almost time, once again, for the *Optimist Brain Bowl competition*. Think of it as Jeopardy with teams for 6, 7, and 8th

grade students. This year, over 1,000 students will again compete, and we need to make sure we have enough volunteers to make the event work. There are three regional competitions: North Region at Standley Lake High School in Westminster January 9; Central Region January 30 at Heritage High School in Littleton: and South Region at Horizon Middle School on February 6. The Championship Tournament will be held February 20 at Hamilton Middle School in Denver. We need about 135 volunteers for each tournament, and closer to 150 for the North Regional. Most volunteers will be done at lunchtime, but we need to staff 12 competition rooms in the afternoon. Joe Marci tells us about the Tree Lot will open next Friday, November 27. For 38 years the Optimist Club of Monaco South has operated the Christmas tree lot at the corner of Monaco and Evans, near the old K-Mart.

The new location will be 2223 South Monaco Parkway, in front of Walmart Market, or directly across the street from last year's location. The Tree Lot is the main fundraiser for the club and funds the great majority of the activities to club sponsors. This is a very important project for the club and we urge all members to participate in helping staff the lot. Members who work five or more shifts will be

able to purchase trees, wreathes, and garland at cost.

The lot is open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. everyday starting November 27 through December 24. The club welcomes non-member volunteers who want to help with manpower.

The most important part of working at the Tree Lot is to have fun, because when you are having fun the customers are able to notice your happiness and experience the fun of buying a tree from the Optimist Club of Monaco South. The OCMS has been operating the Tree Lot since 1978 and many families have been coming back to purchase their trees for decades. It is also very likely you will see and hear
