#### Voters will have the following choices

- 1. Voting at their assigned polling place.
- 2. Voting early at a Voter Service Center.
- Requesting a mail-in ballot. If you are on the list for permanent mail-in ballots you will automatically receive your ballot by mail. Information cards containing the voter's assigned polling place will be mailed to all registered electors in early October.
