When Dudley was not able to help me do the work, that is when Donley Smith took over this great project with his super team. Dudley lived his life as an Optimist! Speaker for Today Russel Dains, Celebrate Life International

Our speaker today was Russel Dains, who is a Youth Development Professional with Celebrate Life International (http://www.celebratelife.org/index.htm). Russel is also the Vice President of the Westminster Optimist Club. He has been working with youth for nine years and his focus has come to target at risk youth

and preventing drop outs. The costs to society of those that drop out of school in terms of incarceration, lost productivity in the work place, and victims' damages, etc. are staggering. With these issues in mind, Russel utilizes a program called Teach One to Lead One (T1L1) to help young people.

T1L1 is a national program focused on building character and leadership in young people through powerful training, practical materials, exciting presentations and hands-on activities. The program has been praised by

government officials for being one of the best programs they've seen for combining mentorship with a solid curriculum. Specifically targeting students in the public school system and juvenile courts (ages 12-18), T1L1 equips students with proven life skills and healthy habits, transforming them into responsible citizens.

Russel talked about trying to get these kids to see others and their specific needs instead of focusing on themselves and what they want. He talked about taking three middle school students to the 16th Street Mall and finding a homeless man to take to McDonalds for lunch. He was able to engage in conversation with this person about his personal story, opening the students' minds to what this man was going through.

The exercise seems to have taken hold with one

student who told Russel about himself taking a homeless man to lunch after meeting him at the Denver Skate Park near downtown.

The T1L1 program incorporates,

- Absolute Truths universal principles such as respect and integrity,
- 2. Healthy Relationships showing these kids that the community is committed to their future, and
- 3. Spirit of Adventure and Celebration they incorporate activities that engage the kids to share their struggles and look for positive solutions.

Many problem cases have become success stories after finding the confidence in them self that comes from knowing others care for them. Russel believes that teens want direction or a sense of purpose, but have seen little of that in too many cases. Many turn to gangs for the sense of belonging they lack in their lives. Unfortunately, this also results in selfish behavior and violence. Program graduates have a positive influence among their peers.
