Metro CareRing Helps Families in Need

The featured speaker for the May 4, 2007 meeting was Jon Holmer, Executive Director of Metro CareRing. Jon was introduced by MSOC member Ron Gustas, who is a member of the board of this non-profit that works with families and individuals to create solutions to hunger, poverty and other difficulties.

Jon defined "poor" as being unable to meet the basic needs of one's family. He stated that a Denver family with two children needs an income of \$39,000 per year to meet its basic needs, while the median income in Denver is \$42,000.

Metro CareRing helped 30,000 people last year, half of whom were children. Jon told us that even if one believes that adults can or should lift themselves out of poverty on their own, it is

unquestionable that children cannot.

Metro CareRing, among its other services, maintains a food bank which receives donations from many sources, including grocery stores. It operates with a small staff and many volunteers. It is located at 1100 E. 18th Avenue (corner of 18th and Downing) and at that location it accepts donations of food and toiletries (not clothing).

A fundraiser for Metro Care Ring will take place this coming Thursday, May 10, when the Curious Theatre (1080 Acoma Street) will present "Mall-Mart: The Musical" at 8 p.m. A number of MSOCers plan to attend. 
Invocation & Pledge
