enjoyed at the lot helping our many customers with their purchases. We received many compliments about the excellent trees and the excellent help our members provided.




#### Santa's White Elephant
















Craig Eley calls Cy Regan's name from the name tag jug but again no winner. Members end the meeting by reciting the creed and greeting this beautiful Friday!


