Fred Pasternack at Animal Sanctuary: Two weeks ago, Freddie's Gateway Optimist Club took 48 kids from Fletcher Elementary to the Wild Animal Sanctuary in Keenesburg. There are 300 animals, lions, tigers, wolves, and bears on the 4,000 acre preserve. They eat 7,500 lbs. of meat a day. Most food is donated by Wal-Mart stores of Colorado. All these animals are rescued from around the world and have a place to live in Colorado. They live about 27 years in captivity. Editor: This is a great example of a submission for the newsletter. Dues Statement is Out: Greg Young, announced today that dues invoices are out. Dues for the year are \$123, which is made up of International dues of \$60.93, (up \$1 from last year), District dues of \$20, and Club dues of \$41.70, for a total of \$122.63, rounded to the nearest dollar. National dues for Life Members are not increasing, so Life Members stay the same as last year, \$88.00. HOWEVER, in keeping with club policy, any member who pays full year dues in the first quarter may take a \$5.00 discount, resulting in dues of \$118 for regular members and \$83 for Life members. Members are encouraged to pay the full year's dues by the end of October to get the discount plus aid your treasurer in reducing the billing burden.

Paul Bernard introduced our speakers, <u>Anne Rowe</u>, newly elected Denver School Board member and <u>Kindra Black</u>, the University of Colorado at Denver's state coordinator for National History Day and TJ High School Spartan Alumni Association representative.

The primary thrust of their presentation was ballot propositions 3A and 3B. The Denver Public Schools 2012 Mill Levy and Bond Proposal involves \$49M and \$466M respectively. The planned distribution of the money is present on this webpage, as shown in a handout given at the meeting. A side benefit will be relief for the existing education budget. More funding can be allocated to staffing, thus increasing the quality of the education environment. We can thank Paul for our informative speakers. I'm sure he would like comments and suggestions for future speakers.
