#### **Our Speaker**

New member **Fred Daniels** introduced our guest speaker, Perry Jowsey, Development Director of Freedom Service Dogs. Website: http://www.freedomservicedogs.org/.



Freedom Service Dogs (FSD) was founded 24 years ago as a result of a 16year old high school student on vacation in Mexico having become a paraplegic due to a swimming accident. The 1<sup>st</sup> FSD service dog brought comfort and aid the young man and he is now leading a positive and productive life.

Perry also told us the story of a young girl suffering from M.S. who was given a Service dog trained to pull her up and assist her in getting out of bed every morning. Something she had never done before until her new friend and companion arrived on the scene. Cerebral Palsy, diabetes and spinal bifida patients are also beneficiaries of the program.

Another remarkable program FSD provides is intensive training—dogs to injured veterans returning from combat, many of them still on active duty soldier. Dogs are trained to help them with prosthetics and mobility issues. CBS News recently featured a special report on the program. You can see that video clip on their home page. As of the first of the year, ten dogs have been provided to date. Training costs up to \$25,000 and takes 9-10 months. Dogs between the age of 1.5 and 3 years are the best qualified. He also noted that all potential service dogs come from animal shelters. Not only does the client benefit but the dogs they are also given a new lease on life. The preferred breed is lab-mix but all dogs between 60-90 pounds are used.

In 2005 only 4 dogs were placed compared to 27 dogs in

2010. There are currently 35 people on a waiting list which can be up to 18 months. Prison K-9 dogs are being used to help with a 10-12 week training regime. Perry recalled the heartwarming story of a 9 year old girl with cancer who had endured an intense chemo therapy



treatment and was in need of a companion dog. She started the "Stink Bug Project" named after her treatment and proceeded to raise money by selling dog biscuits. She was successful and now has a service dog.

FSD takes no government funding and relies solely on the private sector for financing. Their budget this year is 1 million dollars. The major portion of their money goes to training and placing Companion Dogs. There are volunteer opportunities for helping train and walking dogs. There is also a need for Foster Homes while the dogs are in school.

It was decided that all the Happy Dollars and added donations (\$146) would be presented to FSD. A copy of FSD's *Winter Quarterly Newsletter of Freedom Service Dogs* is attached with this issue of GUMS.
